The CMAA was govern by delegates chosen by the counties. Any member was invited to a state meeting but could not speak or vote. They would need to express their views through their county representatives.

You may refer the members to this document if they are concerned about representatives. Today and always it is the responsibility of the county reps/Presidents to know what their members wants.
